<u>Be Born in Us!</u>

"For God, who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' made his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of God's glory displayed in the face of Christ."

-2 Corinthians 4:6



"Sunrise on Iona"

During our time of retreat at the Abbey on the isle of Iona, off the coast of Scotland on our sabbatical it was the first time we visited what is considered a "Thin Place." The understanding of a thin place as described by Rev. George MacLeod, a Scottish minister, who founded the Iona Community in 1938 said, "a thin place where only tissue paper separates the material from the spiritual." We certainly found this to be true during our time of worship, work, and community on Iona. But it has also made me wonder about other thin places and times in our lives when we are able to experience, by God's grace, a more intimate encounter with the presence of God. Recently I came across this wonderful quote from John Philip Newell in his book, "The Rebirthing of God." In it he writes these words about the isle of Iona,

"George MacLeod spoke of Iona as a thin place. It is a place in which we sometimes see briefly through the veil that separates heaven and earth. At times that veil can seem as "thin as gossamer." But to say that Iona is a thin place is not to

say that every other place is thick. Rather, it is to say that lona, and similar sacred sites of pilgrimage and healing throughout the world, are like sacraments or living icons through which we glimpse the Light that is present everywhere. Iona is not a place to cling to, or escape to, but to cherish as a place in which our seeing is renewed, so that when we return to the demanding and conflicted places of our lives and our world we do so with open eyes that have been refreshed."

We share this quote with you because we believe that the same thing that John Philip Newell writes about lona could also be said about the season of Advent. Advent is a season through which, "we glimpse the Light that is present everywhere. Advent is not a place to cling to, or escape to, but to cherish as a season in which our seeing is renewed, so that when we return to the demanding and conflicted places of our lives and our world we do so with open eyes that have been refreshed."

Our theme for this season of Advent is "Be Born in Us!" We want to invite all of us to try and provide a "thin place" for yourself this Advent Season where you can look and listen for God's in-breaking into our lives and into our world. Maybe it is a corner of your room, or a place on a table where there is a candle or a cross, or maybe even a place outside in the beauty of creation (if you don't mind the cold). A place where you can focus a brief amount of time each day to pray and reflect during this Advent season, allowing God to be born in you.

Then as you experience this Advent Season we want to invite you to write down the ways you experience God, whether it is by the Spirit speaking to your heart, in a conversation with a friend, in special celebration, in news you hear, or even in the ordinary tasks of the day. Write them down and place them in a special place. We will have bags for you to use that are available in church. Then read them together throughout the 12 days of Christmas, stretching from Christmas Day to Epiphany, January 6. During this season of Advent and Christmas we pray that God will open our eyes to the thin places all around us and that the Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love of God may be Born in Us! Onto this corner, this street, into this neighborhood, this home, into these hands, and in hands around the globe, we ask that you come. Be born in us today. All of us. Be born anew, and change the world. Amen Amen Amen "For Today My Light is Born in You" by Ann Gerondelis

The Schoharie Community Food Pantry is a ministry housed at the Schoharie United Presbyterian Church, but one that involves the larger faith community. Food Pantry Report November 2017

The Schoharie Community Food Pantry continues to operate due to the grace of God expressed through the efforts of many people in our community. Every person who arrives at the pantry seeking help leaves with food enough for three days, and we follow the guidelines of the Regional Food Bank to make that happen. One day this month we served 18 families, but on other occasions the number is just a handful. Our volunteers continue to be a dedicated group of wonderful people.

Sometimes people ask what items could most be used at the pantry. I would say that spaghetti sauce and peanut butter are the two items that are most missed by our clients when they are gone. However, any donation of cereal, pasta, tuna fish, soup and canned goods of any kind are always gratefully received.

In addition, it is helpful to remember the non-food items that are often difficult for folks to buy, such as toilet paper, toothpaste, shampoo, laundry detergent, dish soap, etc. These non-food items cannot be purchased with SNAP (food stamps) so are a precious commodity to our folks.

And last, but certainly not least, you can support this ministry through your prayers! Pray for the volunteers, for our clients and that this ministry would continue to be there for people who need it.

There are numerous "little" jobs (install door sweeps, weather stripping, vacuum, painting, building shelves, etc.) that you can do yourself at your convenience. Contact Dave Toborg if (295-8554, dtoborg@midtel.net) if you can help out.

Donations Being a church facility, from time to time there is a need for a second fridge and a large upright freezer; keep the Fellowship Hall in mind if you learn of a good clean unit for donation. Also looking for a larger flat screen TV (55"+) to hang on the wall. It would need HDMI and USB ports.

Winter is coming

Snow After a 1" snowfall, our snow plow contractor plows the parking lot and shovels the steps, ramp, and the street sidewalk. Lesser amounts, however, are our responsibility - so please be encouraged to grab a broom and/or shovel for the nuisance snows that pop up all winter long. Don't wait for someone else to do it. Especially keep the steps and ramp clear so the sun can do its thing thereby reducing usage of ice melting agents.

Note that we use plastic shovels (without steel edges) to minimize damage to the wooden steps and ramp. When necessary, there is a beige plastic tote full of magnesium chloride on the Heritage House porch. Compared to rock salt, magnesium chloride is less corrosive to the steel fasteners holding together the wooden steps and ramps.

Heat Both buildings have programmable thermostats. If you need to raise the temperature for an event, simply press the up arrow until the desired temperature shows (typically 68°). And remember to turn it down when you leave. If the schedule needs permanent adjustment AND you are comfortable doing so, then go ahead and change the program. If not, contact Dave Toborg.
