Present over Perfect

"I remain confident of this: I will see the goodness of the LORD in the land of the living." -Psalm 27:13

Several years ago, the A&E television station ran a series of advertisements on cable television with the theme of, "Escape the Ordinary." Escape the ordinary. If we are honest, there have probably been times in our lives when that has sounded really good to us. Times when we felt like the life we were living had somehow "fallen short" of the perfect image we once dreamed. Or times when it left us exhausted because we just couldn't keep up with all of the needs, and demands in the ways we felt like we "should."

As a result, we became worn down, fed up, and burned out by an everyday life that left us drained of energy and empty of meaning. Along the way, we are also continually tempted by the siren call of our consumer culture that wants us to believe that our happiness and our wholeness are found in something outside of our everyday lives. Whether it is turning on the television, taking a vacation, buying something new, or changing our appearance, the message is the same – "Your real happiness and wholeness are not found in your current life. But what if the reality was that our everyday, "ordinary" lives held all of the joy and fulfillment we truly longed for and that it comes to us not by our "escaping" but by our "deepening?" The Psalmist declares, "I will see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living." What if that were truly so for us? What if we could slow down and even cease our exhaustion, transform our perception of ordinary into extraordinary, and instead of looking beyond, look around and discover the "goodness of the Lord" in our everyday lives? In her book, "Present over Perfect," author Shauna Niequist writes these words,

"Present is living with your feet firmly grounded in reality, pale and uncertain as it may seem. Present is choosing to believe that your own life is worth investing deeply in, instead of waiting for some rare miracle or fairytale. Present means we understand that the here and now is sacred, sacramental, threaded through with divinity even in its plainness. Especially in its plainness."

Over the course of the next month we want to invite you to take a journey with us through the book "Present over Perfect" as we discover the blessings, the joys, and the hopes of truly getting present to our lives, as well as the reality of God's goodness and grace in our midst. We hope you will join us for this journey as we seek to live more fully into the lives God has blessed us with, and discover the extraordinary love and goodness of God in the midst of our ordinary days! This book will be the focus of our Monday evening small group at 7:00pm, as well as a Wednesday morning small group at 10:00am.
