Another Year Is Dawning!



"Yet you have made (us) a little lower than God, and crowned (us) with glory and honor." -Psalm 8:5 NRSV

> "Another year is dawning: Dear God let it be, In working or in waiting, Another year with Thee Another year of progress, Another year of praise, Another year of proving Thy presence all the days." Hymn: <u>Another Year Is Dawning.</u> By Samuel Wesley.

Another year has dawned! As we say goodbye to another year we may have both bitter and sweet feelings about it. Perhaps there were some good things to celebrate that took place in your life over this past year, or maybe there were some really hard things that are continuing to impact you. As we know, with each new year comes a new wave of hopes and desires for us to change things in our lives, to see good things come for us and for those we love, and also to see things change for the betterment of our world. While the church "new year" starts with the beginning of Advent, we recognize that God's mercies are "new every morning" and "never come to an end." God invites us into God's newness every day (Lamentations 3:22f)! Have you made some of those cultural "New Year's Resolutions" to try and bring about some of your hopes and desires? How does the reality of God being "Born in us" make a difference in all of this? One of the greatest things that can impact our efforts for growth, change, and transformation in our lives is the story we tell about ourselves as we seek to live out our lives in new ways. As I (Pastor Mike) thought about my own resolutions, I had a startling realization that for myself, they all come from places of shame and deficiency. So often my voice of "resolution" sounds like, "You should really do more of..." or "You really need to be better at..." or "You really need to get into..." or "If you want your life to be better, than you'd better get better at..."

Which got me wondering...what might it be like to begin this new year with a new story? What if we start from a story that doesn't desire change or transformation from a place of shame or deficiency but rather from a place of Belovedness? What if we claim what we know starting with this sense of belovedness that the Psalmist describes when they write of God's view of human beings, "You have made them a little lower than God, and crowned them with glory and honor"?

What if our resolutions didn't come from a voice that says, "You need to get into..." or "You should really do more of..." Or "You really need to be better at..." Instead what if they came from a place that says:

"You are a beloved child of God and you can do whatever God has put on your heart to do because God is with you! It will be hard. You will fail, because failure is a part of learning and growth. It will take time! You will need to be patient with yourself and others. It's taken a long time for you to build your current habits, so it will take time to tear them down and build better ones, but with God's help, with the community of faith beside you, you can do it!"

What happens when we live from that place of belovedness? For me, it helps combat the voice of shame that has caused me to give up so many times before and I can live with more joy and grace in all of the ups and downs that life brings. I also become more willing to risk vulnerability, to share hopes with others and to create communities of love and support. We will have more courage to face the tougher challenges, trusting that though the changes may be really hard, they will also be really good! As another year has dawned, we want to challenge all of us to wonder about your hopes and desires for growth, change, and transformation in this new year for your health (physical, mental, spiritual, and emotional), your spirituality specifically, your relationships with others, and your mission in the world.

For me (Pastor Sherri), I've noticed that sometimes I get stuck in a particular story, and I've noticed others struggling with the same issue. What stories do you retell about the way things are in your life? Are those empowering stories? What could you do to stop being a broken record and start living into more of the story you dream about living?

How are feelings of shame and deficiency keeping you from dreaming, or keeping your from making progress toward your hopes and dreams? May our hopes and dreams, old and new, continue to emerge from a story of belovedness that we are God's and God is with us!

Our hope for all of us as a church family in this new year is that we will continue to live into being and becoming a community of beloved children who are Growing in God and Living in Love.

Christmas Greetings, Sisters and Brothers! See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! (I John 3:1) What joy we share in knowing that we belong to the Prince of Peace, Mighty God, Everlasting Father! And, our participation in Operation Christmas Child has shared the Good News of our Messiah with millions of children around the world. Thank you for filling shoeboxes with much needed gifts for the children and for your prayers to support the project.

Collection week 2017 netted a harvest of 1,530 shoeboxes at our drop-off site. That was an increase of 27 over last year. Many, if not all, of those boxes are headed for children in the Dominican Republic. December 1 & 2 found me at the Maryland/Washington, DC Area processing center. I was privileged to serve alongside volunteers from Latham Community Church. We were addressed by two "full circle children" during our time there. One was Jaki who was raised in a Guatemalan orphanage where a single toothbrush had to be shared among all of the children. The other was a Ukrainian named Maria who now lives in Ohio where she is an art teacher. A box of crayons in a shoebox affirmed for her that God knows everything about her. Hearing these young women share their stories reinforced our belief that God uses our simple gifts in mighty ways to bless children.

As I look ahead to a new year of serving our Lord through Operation Christmas Child, I am making a commitment to be more disciplined in prayer.
