*"God destined us for adoption as God's children through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of God's will."  
-Ephesians 1:5*

### The Heidelberg Catechism Q & A 1:

Question: What is your only comfort in life and in death?

Answer: That I am not my own, but belong body and soul, in life and in death to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ. He has fully paid for all my sins with his precious blood and has set me free from the tyranny of evil. He also watches over me in such a way that not a hair can fall from my head without the will of my Father in heaven; in fact, all things must work together for my salvation.



Belonging. Woven into the fabric of every human heart is the deep desire to belong. We first experience belonging in our families of origin. In our relationships with parents, siblings, and extended family, through positive and negative experiences, we felt this desire to belong. We felt it in friend groups and peer relationships where we developed ways of being in order to “fit in.” For those of us who are adults today the desire to belong is why we seek out companionship, join clubs, tour groups, gyms, civic organizations, and churches. The desire to belong is a part of being human.

Often times what drives our desires to belong and also impacts our being in the places where we belong is our own sense of worth. Think of the places where you experience belonging in your life right now. How does your own sense of worth impact the ways you show up in those places? Sometimes when our own sense of worth feels threatened we react in one of two ways. On one hand we might cut ourselves off by putting up walls, going silent, or withdrawing altogether in order to protect ourselves. Or on the other hand we change, or give up self so that we no longer show up as our true selves but instead we seek to adapt more of the manners and the mentality of the group in order to better “fit in.”

But what if there was another way for us to experience and to live out “belonging” in the world? What if our sense of worth was not found in our circles of belonging but in something deeper? And what if this deeper sense of belonging allowed us to stay connected even to people with whom we experience difficulty and disagreement? Or what if it could allow us to stand completely alone out of our deepest convictions and still know that we belong?

The answer we believe to all of this is found in the deeper belonging that God desires for us to experience in our lives. It is this belonging that Paul writes about in his letter to the Ephesians when he tells them of how God has “destined us for adoption through Jesus Christ.” It is the same good news we find in the first answer of the Heidelberg Catechism to the question of “What is your only comfort in life and in death?” “That I am not my own, but belong body and soul, in life and in death, to my faithful savior, Jesus Christ.”

God desires us to live our lives out of this deeper sense of belonging that is found in God’s love and claiming of our lives for God’s self. We belong because of God’s love! Nothing can qualify us for it, and nothing can disqualify us from it. It is fully and completely the choice and the action of God’s love for us! How does it impact you to think about living your life from a place of knowing that you already belong? I love how the answer ends when it says, *“Because I belong to him, Christ, by his Holy Spirit, assures me of eternal life and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for him.”* Does the belonging you are experiencing in your own life right give you comfort in your own sense of worth? Is it inspiring you to live “wholeheartedly” for God? Author Brene Brown writes about belonging in her book, *“Braving the Wilderness.”* While writing from a secular perspective she has some great, well-researched, insights about belonging. This is one of her quotes and we have edited to include how the faith perspective would say it:

*“True belonging is the spiritual practice of believing in and belonging to yourself (**God**) so deeply that you can share your most authentic self with the world and find sacredness in both being a part of something and standing alone in the wilderness. True belonging doesn’t require you to change who are; it requires you to be who you are (**in Christ**).”*

During worship this summer we are going to look at the “belonging” that God intends for our lives to be experienced in our relationship with God and to be lived out with one another in the world. **Just a reminder that in July and August we will be moving worship to 9:30am in the sanctuary.** Please come join us whether you have been doing so for a long time, or whether you have gotten out of the habit, whether you see yourself as a good church member, or a seeking soul, whoever you are, and whatever your experience has been you belong to God, and there is a place for you to belong with us as well.

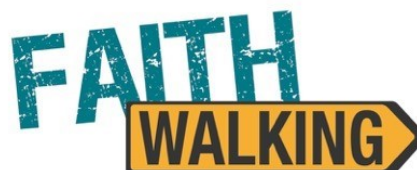

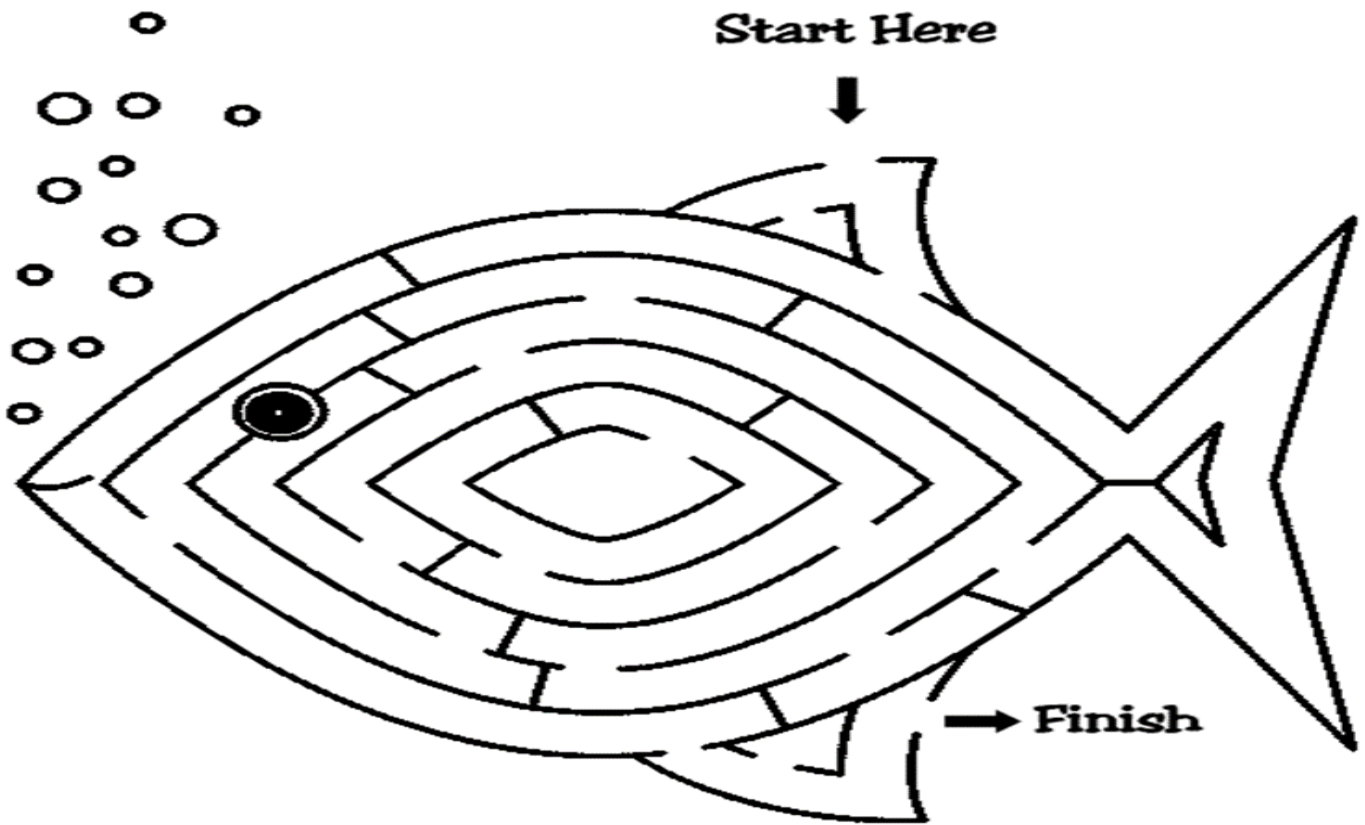
