Following Jesus

"If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it." -Matthew 16:24-25 NRSV

I believe that's why Jesus came as a human being: not to teach us how to go to heaven, but to teach us how to be a fully alive human being here on this

"It's not the journey, it's the destination." Or, "It's not the destination, it's the journey." Which is it? How do you often think about that phrase? I (Pastor Mike) used to always travel as a "destination" person. What that means is that I would travel on most of our vacations with the mindset that my vacation started when we got to the place where we were going. As a result, I was often moody during the travel, I would get annoyed at delays or hold-ups, and many times I would just "check-out" and distract my-self with something like music, or a book, food, or naps, until we finally got to where we were going, when in my mind everything would "start."

However, I have learned over the years how to become much more of a "journey" person when I travel. What I realized was that I was choosing to waste a lot of time, conversations, and experiences that I could have been having if I had taken the time to enjoy the journey. Sure, it is always wonderful to reach the destination, but I have learned that the journey to get there is just as much of an important part of the trip, in fact, I was missing out on all that God might have had for me along the way. Sometimes, when we are open to it, God speaks to us in ways along our journey that change our destination all together!

All of this makes me wonder if we don't feel some of this same tension during the season of Lent? With our eagerness for Spring, and the promise of warmer, and greener weather, with the consumer culture quickly jumping from Valentine's Day, to St. Patrick's Day, to Easter, and maybe even with some of the more uncomfortableness that seems to surround Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, there can be a tension to want to move too quickly into the season of Easter.

Now Easter is the best destination for which we could ever hope! Jesus rising from the dead, victory over the grave, the promise of eternal life, it truly is the Good News! But what about the rest of Lent? Is it only a countdown to Easter? Or a time to discipline ourselves as we try to give something up; be miserable now so we can experience delayed gratification? Or an opportunity to plan more church events to help pass the time until spring? Or is there something more for us in this journey we call Lent? I started realizing that sometimes we have this same mentality of "destination focus" in church, and miss the journey. For example, a lot of our liturgy and the promises we claim focus on events that will take place in the future: when God makes all things right, when we experience full shalom with God in heaven, and when the world is fully redeemed. What if it were true that Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, has as much to say to us about our life right now, as it does about our after-life? What if the lessons Jesus taught to his disciples were meant for us in our discipleship as well? What if Jesus' relationship with God had a lot to say about our relationship with God? How would all this change how you journey through Lent? Our friend and colleague John Sparks puts it this way,

"If Christianity is only about missing hell and arriving in heaven, and discipleship is a special classification reserved for a special few Super-Christians, no wonder there is so little interest in hearing and obeying Jesus. Without discipleship, Christianity centers on getting people into heaven when they die rather than **getting heaven into people while they live.**"

I'm learning what this might mean, and how good it is for us to focus more on the journey and more on what it

means to recognize God's work in our world and lives now, not only in the future. This Lent we want to invite you on a special journey together as a church family as we look at journeying with Jesus. Recognizing the fundamental truth that in his life, we find our lives, and that discipleship is not just knowing how to "get to heaven," but it is also about growing in our relationships and our life with God in the world here and now.

In addition to our Lenten worship services, you are invited to a special book study of Max Lucado's book, "Just Like Jesus." There are opportunities to be part of a small group on Wednesday evenings and Sunday mornings throughout Lent. You can sign-up in the sanctuary or by contacting the church office. All are welcome. If you'd like to donate towards the cost of a book, they are \$10 each. We will also have a special Ecumenical Ash Wednesday service to begin Lent at 7:00pm on February 14, at Schoharie United Presbyterian Church. What better day to share in the hope of God's love for all of us! Please join us for this Lenten journey that it may deepen our relationships and enrich our lives. Have a blessed Lent!

Building and Grounds

With winter fully ensconced, things are quiet. The pew contractor continues the refinishing. Once done, the pews will be set in place and reassembled. Our other contractor will return soon to wrap up a number of things including: handrails, balcony corner (for the small organ), door closures, door trim, etc.

<u>Carpets</u> - Doesn't the narthex look good? The same carpeting will be installed in the west end of the balcony when ready.

We also retrieved our carpets that had been in storage since Hurricane Irene. Turns out that two pieces did not clean up well (including the most important center aisle runner) and had been thrown away. To give folks a feel for the center, we temporarily laid out a short, narrow runner. The good news is that the vendor should be able to match (or get close to) our existing runners should we desire to get a replacement.

<u>Why was Worship cancelled January 7?</u> - Heat was intermittent in both buildings due to a propane line that would freeze with the extended cold. The furnaces were running at 6:30 am before the line froze again. The problem was addressed; and it should not be an issue in the future.
