



Moved by Love

*"When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who had come along with her also weeping, he was deeply moved in spirit and troubled."*

- John 11:33

I remember several years ago sitting in a clergy meeting with a group of fellow pastors. We were discussing an article written by a religious writer arguing that Christians of the time seemed to be focusing more on the suffering and pain of Jesus, and not enough on the resurrection and victory of Jesus over pain, suffering, and death. I remember one colleague explaining how he saw things through an interesting analogy about being a patient in a hospital. He said, "Imagine if you were a patient in a hospital dying of an illness. Which would you rather have in that moment – a person who was sick and suffering in the bed next to you, who could relate with your own pain and suffering, or would you want the doctor with the cure for your illness?" Now given the choice between those two options it probably seems like a "no-brainer." I think all of us would opt to have the doctor with the cure.

But the more I have thought about this analogy and the more I have brought it to the actual person of Jesus that we encounter in the gospels, I have come to see that there is a breakdown with this analogy. The breakdown is that with Jesus, it is not an "either/or" situation, but rather a "both/and." We don't have to choose. We get both. In the love of Jesus, we get both the victorious savior and the suffering servant. We get one who offers us healing and hope, as well as one who meets us in our pain with true compassion and deep empathy. We can

see this clearly in the story of the resurrection of Lazarus. Twice in the story, before Lazarus is raised, John tells us that Jesus was “deeply moved.” And of course, there is also the classic verse, “Jesus wept.” Jesus does tell them, “*I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die.*” But he allows them to express their feelings of pain and even anger, “*Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died.*” Jesus also allows himself to feel his own feelings of grief, sorrow, and loss. Not once does Jesus tell them that they should not be feeling what they are, or that they are being unfaithful or untrusting in their expressions of grief. Rather he allows their pain and sorrow to move him deeply.

I can’t help but wonder if that isn’t an important piece of the story? For Jesus to not just give us a sign of his resurrection power, but also to make room for sharing in the anger, hurt, fear, pain, and loss we all feel as a part of being human. Perhaps Jesus is sharing his own heart for us to be challenged in how we share ours? Do we have the courage to enter into the pain of another? Can we let go of our needs to “fix” or “convince” and our desires to “lessen” or “recolor” the pain and grief of others, in order for us to truly share with them in love? Can we instead allow their pain to touch us in the depths of our own lives, that we can truly share tears and love with them? Perhaps it is the courage to be “moved by love” that helps us find our way to resurrection hope?

Let us be reminded of the last verse of the hymn, “*Let Your Heart Be Broken.*”

*Let your heart be tender and your vision clear*

*Serve mankind as God sees, serve him far and near*

*Let your heart be broken by a brother’s pain*

*Share your rich resources, give and give again.*

May the hope of the resurrection free us from the fears of suffering with others, that we may share compassion, empathy, and love with them, feel it in ourselves, and together celebrate the joy of resurrection in this season, and in every season!

## Building & Grounds

### Fellowship Hall Renovations

Framing is nearly done – the space is again starting to look like a Fellowship Hall (meeting room, kitchen, toilets). “Boxing in” ductwork and other detail around the ceiling takes time. Rough plumbing and electric is underway.

Next will be to finish the rough plumbing and electric; followed by the smoke alarm system. Sheetrocking starts the middle of April. We are shopping for kitchen cabinets.

### Sanctuary

Our sound system is operational. We expect to hang our big flat screen monitor early this month. After that will be the hearing aid enhancement system.

**Pews** – Using feedback from the congregation, the seating group determined that a mix of our pews with loose upholstered “worship” chairs would be the best way to honor our Church’s history while providing flexibility to meet different needs (including wheelchair and handicap space). Specifically, the first row of pews (as you walk into the Sanctuary) and the last two rows (toward the pulpit) will be replaced with chairs. Upholstery will complement the carpet runners.

A local contractor is currently refinishing the pews we will need. The refinished units will be stacked in the Sanctuary until all are completed and then reassembled. Toward the end, Sunday worship may get crowded - some folks may need to sit in the balcony.


## Can You Hear Me Now?



## Schoharie Valley Community Camp

Schoharie Valley Community Camp will be held from July 17-21. We will once again be working with the Schoharie United Presbyterian Church and Christ the Shepherd Lutheran Church to design a fun, interesting Christian program for children from the age of 4 to the eighth grade.
