Taking to the "High-Way" "The Lord had said to Abram, 'Leave your country, your people and your father's household and go to the land I will show you. I will make you into a great nation and I will bless you; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all the peoples of the earth will be blessed through you." -Genesis 12:1-3

We all know the phrase, we've heard other people use it, and maybe we have even used it ourselves a time or two. It is a phrase that evokes a sense of absolute power, supreme authority, and dominant control whenever it has been uttered by a fed-up parent, a fired-up coach, a frustrated teacher, or anyone else who has felt the need to declare...ITS MY WAY OR THE HIGHWAY! But while this phrase may find a voice at different times in our lives, and even more and more it seems today to be echoing the divisive voices of our culture, it seems clear from Scripture that the voice of God is ever-calling us

as disciples to take the "High-Way"! But what does this mean? The High-Way of God and the High-Way of the Holy Spirit is not the way of cutting off, separating, or distancing ourselves from people with whom we don't agree, or get along, as we see so much today in our "either/or" culture. It is not either/or, but instead, a deeper way of connecting and relating with God, and with people in the world that moves us from a perspective of privilege to one of service, love, and generosity! On July 21st we got to hear a great sermon from Rev. Josh Bode who visited us as our missionary guest as a part of our partnership with the historic RCA mission in Oman. He preached on Jeremiah 29:1-14. One phrase that really stuck out to me (Pastor Mike), from his sermon was, "God will take your power, privilege, and control to bring you peace. God loves us that much!" I hear a similar truth being spoken to Abram when God calls him in Genesis 12 to, *"leave your country, your people, and your father's household and go the land I will show you."* Abram was called to leave his livelihood, his sense of community, his safety, his privilege, his future inheritance, his entire sense of belonging and security to follow a God he did not know. Abram was being called by God out of a reality where his wealth, his worth, his identity, and his power were all based on who he was, what he had, and what he could do, and into a reality based on faith, trust, and dependence on God found in a promise.

In this promise from God there is the hope of becoming great, in numbers and in name, but all of this is intended "to be a blessing" for "all the peoples of the earth." While we often take them for granted, most of us recognize on some level that our lives are blessed. But do we see our blessing as opportunities and resources for blessing others? Often our perspectives of privilege lead us to a worldview that gives us permission to take what we want because the opportunities are equal, and the playing field is level. But human greed, and our own dark history tell us this is just not the case. God has created us and called us to a "High-Way" that is less about taking, and more about blessing. If this is so, then how do I bless the people suffering across the world I don't know? How do I bless my neighbors who seem to be struggling to make ends meet? How do I bless the person on social media who has very different political ideologies than I do? How do I bless the person who has suffered unjustly because of their nationality or race? What needs to change in me so that I can more faithfully take God's "High-Way"?

This summer our theme in worship has been "Catching the Spirit." As we look and listen for the Holy Spirit at work all around us let us find courage and faith to wonder together, how is God calling us out of lives based on our own security, power, and productivity and into deeper relationships of obedience, trust, and dependence? How is God also calling us to use our positions of privilege "to be a blessing" to "all the peoples on earth"? Or to put in another way, how is God calling us to let go of our own way and take "The High-Way"? Not a way of cut-off, or distancing that reflects our divisive "either/or" culture, but the High-Way of learning to live more deeply in relationship with the Spirit in the world, and in love with all people!

A Time & A New Plan for Sunday School

The consistory has received feedback from the congregation and has decided to move the time of our regular worship service to 9:30am for the fall season. The consistory will again review this change in late December/early January. As our Sunday school leaders prepare to offer another year of quality Christian Education for the children and youth of our church, they have come up with a creative idea to try out along with the 9:30am worship time change.

When Sunday school begins there will be three different age groups offered for Sunday school. The first group, Pre-K through 2^{nd} grade will go downstairs to the community room following the children's time during the worship service. There they will have their Sunday school lesson until the end of the worship service. The other two groups will be the $3^{rd} - 4^{th}$ graders, along with 5^{th} and beyond. They will come over to the Heritage House following the sermon and their Sunday school time will run until approximately 15 minutes past the end of the worship service. Then parents will be able to get their kids and bring them home. In addition to this change there will be no Sunday school on communion Sundays (the first Sunday of every month), so that families can celebrate communion together. There will also be a time of praise singing for kids and adults who wish to attend prior to the prelude and the beginning of the worship service.

We will be contacting Sunday school families prior to the start of Sunday school with a program schedule and complete information regarding each of these changes. We invite all children to attend our program and to please feel free to share this information with their friends and invite them to join along!
