### **The Healing of Advent**

"The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" (which means "God with us").

-Matthew 1:23

One of the favorite songs of the Advent/Christmas season for Pastor Sherri and Pastor Mike is a song by an artist named Chris Rice entitled, "Welcome to Our World." Take a moment to read and reflect on the lyrics:

#### Welcome to Our World by Chris Rice

Tears are falling, hearts are breaking How we need to hear from God You've been promised, we've been waiting Welcome Holy Child.

Hope that You don't mind our manger How I wish we could have known But long-awaited Holy Stranger Make Yourself at home

Please make Yourself at home Bring Your peace into our violence Bid our hungry souls be filled Word now breaking Heaven's silence Welcome to our world.

Fragile finger sent to heal us Tender brow prepared for thorn Tiny heart whose blood will save us Unto us is born.

So wrap our injured flesh around You Breathe our air and walk our sod Rob our sins and make us holy Perfect Son of God Welcome to our world. This song seems to speak to the deep need for Christ's presence to be experienced anew in our hearts and in our world because there are many "tears falling and hearts breaking" within us and all around us right now. In so many ways 2020 has been a difficult and challenging year. Several people we know have lost loved ones to this terrible, on-going pandemic. We have even lost a couple of beloved people we have known in these past several months. Others have lost employment or had to close businesses that were their life's dream, and sense of purpose. Others have dealt with the loss of significant events that could not be held, and others are continuing to face the changes and challenges that this pandemic continues to cause for us and for others. New routines, new things to learn, and the constant changes of protocols and procedures, along with the worries and threats of lockdown have all caused fatigue and frustration along with the rises of anxiety and depression.

There also continues to be a lot polarization going on within us and around us. We have seen and felt political polarization, and polarization about racism and the varying reactions that continue to go on around us and within us. It seems like the divides keep growing while our abilities to empathize with others, share our convictions with kindness, and nuance our perspectives keeps shrinking. We have also had other health concerns, losses, changes, and struggles during these times as well.

But the good news of Advent is that even into a pandemic, during political turmoil, racial unrest, as well as personal pains, griefs, losses and changes, we are invited to welcome anew the reality of Immanuel, "God with us" into our world and into our hearts and our lives! Christ comes to heal, to bring peace into our violence, to feed our hungry souls, and to make us holy. The challenge for us is to do the work of preparing our hearts and lives to welcome Christ anew in this Advent season.

Throughout this season of Advent, we are going to look together at the theme of "The Healing of Advent." We invite you to join in our "Cloth for The Cradle" Advent activity, which was adapted from the Iona Community in Scotland. You can do this activity on your own, or with your church family on Wednesday evenings at 6:30pm by Zoom. A packet will be coming to you shortly (if you haven't received one in church already) so please look for one to be dropped off to you or to arrive in the mail.

Our prayer in this Advent season is that the celebration of Christ's coming and the hope, peace, love, and joy that Christ brings through his presence will be a source of comfort, courage, and healing for you, your family, our community, and world in this Advent season.

As we prepare to welcome Christ anew this Advent, may we take some intentional time to prepare to welcome God into our hearts and our world!

## Buildings & Grounds

#### Fall Clean-Up

After being rained out the previous weekend, Fall Clean-Up on November 7 was very successful. A large turn-out of members made short work of the leaves, cleaned out the landscaping, trimmed branches, and generally had a good time making our property look well kept.

#### Winter stuff

**Snow** After a 1" snowfall, our snow plow contractor plows the parking lot and shovels the steps, ramp, and street sidewalk. Lesser amounts, however, are our responsibility - so please be encouraged to grab a broom and/or shovel for the nuisance snows that pop up all winter long. Don't wait for someone else to do it. Especially keep the steps and ramp clear so the sun can do its thing thereby reducing usage of ice melting agents.

Note that we use plastic shovels (without steel edges) to minimize damage to the wooden steps and ramp. When necessary, there is a beige plastic tote full of magnesium chloride on the Heritage House porch. Compared to rock salt, magnesium chloride is less corrosive to the steel fasteners holding together the wooden steps and ramps.

**Heat** Both buildings have programmable thermostats. If you need to raise the temperature for an event, simply press the up arrow until the desired temperature shows (typically 68°). And remember to turn it down when you leave. If the schedule needs permanent adjustment AND you are comfortable doing so, then go ahead and change the program. If not, contact Dave Toborg.

# Cold Weather and COVID Planning

The Consistory of the Schoharie Reformed Church has met regularly throughout the pandemic and has been navigating all of the difficult decisions that are important to be made for our spiritual, mental, emotional, AND physical well-being during a pandemic. Please thank your consistory for this difficult work for which none were prepared. They are a diverse group that span the varied and polarizing perspectives, yet have refused to polarize, have continued to pour through loads of information, have listened well to each other, have remained open to feedback and have tried to take into account all perspectives, and have unanimously made most decisions.

The consistory has decided, beginning November 15, we will use these benchmarks for gathering in-person and when we will meet online.

If the predicted high for the Sunday morning (using weather.com) is 20 degrees or less, we will move to online worship through zoom only for that day. (We are required to leave windows open for ventilation as a part of our safety plan.)

If the county threat level rises to orange or red based on the rate of infection and number of cases, we will move to virtual. Similarly, if the school goes virtual due to the virus levels, we will also move to virtual at that point as well.

Additionally, as a reminder of our in-person safety plan: Anyone who has been in person in the church buildings that displays symptoms must report your symptoms to the church office as soon as they occur, be tested, and quarantine. Should anyone who has been in person test positive, we will also move to virtual for two weeks and do a thorough cleaning.

We have been so fortunate that the weather on Sunday mornings has cooperated with our plans, however, we know January is likely to change that, if not before. Please note that several of our sister churches and nearby school districts have had cases of COVID positive persons and have had to go to virtual worship for a time. Safety protocol seem to be making a difference! Thank you for your prayers and continued support of each other. We will continue to get through this together!

### Christmas Eve Candlelight

This year due to the pandemic our Christmas Eve Candlelight Service will look different. We want to be open and accessible to as many people as possible for this special time of worship and celebration. Because we cannot accommodate a community Christmas Eve service in our sanctuary, we are exploring some alternative worship options for our Christmas Eve Candlelight service. Our current plan is to create an online worship service that anyone can access from home at any time they chose on Christmas Eve or later. We are also exploring the possibility of having a brief outdoor Christmas Eve service with masks, and physical distancing in our church parking lot where we would have a brief time of worship including lighting candles and singing. Please stay tuned for more information as plans become finalized. Thank you for your grace and understanding during this ever-changing time.

# Schoharie Christian After School Program

As we approach 2021, we are grateful for the support you've shown our program and are looking ahead at our options and priorities for the future. Due to the decrease in enrollment and the increase in costs to ensure the safety for both students and employees, we are asking for your further support as we make some necessary changes.

Beginning January 1, 2021, the invoice cost will be increasing \$2 per day.
