Unwrapped by Advent



"Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, "This child is destined for the falling and rising of many in Israel and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed – and a sword will pierce your own soul

-Luke 2:34-35

I recently came across this prayer attributed to Sir. Francis Drake, an English sea captain, privateer, slave trader, naval officer and explorer of the Elizabethan era. While it is true that he was not the kindest of human beings, and he did not lead a very exemplary life, by the grace of God he has given us a very powerful and moving prayer that I find to be very fitting for this Advent season. This is going to be my prayer for this Advent season and I want to challenge you to make it your prayer as well, as we prepare our hearts to be unwrapped by the in-breaking of Christ into our world at Christmas!

This Advent season we want to share the coming light of Christ's Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love through our experience of being "Unwrapped by Advent." During our worship together on Sunday morning, and during our special Soup and Bread Advent evenings on Wednesday nights in the Heritage House, we will explore this theme together. Being unwrapped by Advent is not something we do ourselves, it is not our unwrapping of God, but rather it is God's unwrapping of us. Think about it for a moment, in fact close your eyes and picture a child excitedly opening their gift on Christmas morning. There is a disturbance, a tearing apart, a breaking open of what was neat, orderly, shiny, and beautiful on the outside in order to get to what is good, enjoyable, life-giving, and love-shaped on the inside. While it is not easy, or neat, or comfortable, especially when it comes to our own lives, isn't this really what we hope for in Christ's coming? That the reality of God's love would help us to tear down our false selves, to take off our fake masks, to remove our walls of fear, and to shine a light into our hidden places, that we may discover the gift of who God made us to be! Then with Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love be able to live courageously and freely as God's beloved people and experience the deeper purposes and abundance for which God created us!

This Advent may Christ's coming (God's in-breaking into our world) truly disturb us! Then in that holy disturbance may we find the adventure of a deeper, richer, and fuller life with God. "The light shines in the darkness and the darkness did not overcome it" (Jn. 1:5).




Christmas Memorial Plants

Season of Advent

As the season of Advent begins, we will once again be holding our Soup and Bread Advent evenings. We will begin on Wednesday, December 5th at 6:00pm in the Heritage House. We will have a light soup and bread dinner followed by a brief worship service and reflection on the Advent Season. Our two other Advent evenings will be held on Wednesday the 12th, and the 19th. These evenings are open to all ages! There is a sign-up sheet for soup and bread in the narthex.



This year during the season of Advent we are offering special devotional books. Celebrating Abundance" by Walter Brueggamann is a great devotional book to read on your own or as a family each day of the Advent season. The books are free to you, but if you would like to donate, the cost of each book is \$15.00. We will have several copies available at the start of Advent, but to help us make sure we have enough please sign-up for a book in the Narthex or email the church office to request a copy. These are great ways to celebrate the Advent season, especially for busy families!

Buildings and Grounds

Snow After a 1" snowfall, our snow plow contractor plows the parking lot and shovels the steps, ramp, and the street sidewalk. Lesser amounts, however, are our responsibility- so please be encouraged to grab a broom and/or shovel for the nuisance snows that pop up all winter long. Don't wait for someone else to do it. Especially keep the steps and ramp clear so the sun can do its thing thereby reducing usage of ice melting agents.



Note that we use plastic shovels (without steel edges) to minimize damage to the wooden steps and ramp. When necessary, there is a beige plastic tote full of magnesium chloride on the Heritage House porch. Compared to rock salt, magnesium chloride is less corrosive to the steel fasteners holding together the wooden steps and ramps.

Heat Both buildings have programmable thermostats. If you need to raise the temperature for an event, simply press the up arrow until the desired temperature shows (typically 68°). And remember to turn it down when you leave. If the schedule needs permanent adjustment AND you are comfortable doing so, then go ahead and change the program. If not, contact Dave Toborg.
