Message from the Interim Pastor

Hard Shell of a Turtle: Soft Wings of God

"For you have been my refuge, a strong tower against the foe. I long to dwell in your tent forever and take refuge in the shelter of your wings. For you have heard my vows, O God..."

- Psalm 61: 2-5

I forgot that at this time of year, now mid-June, one of the joys of driving from Glen to Schoharie or Cobleskill is the turtle population. These are the only places I've seen turtles on the move. I was recently reminded of this on my way to the church as I turned off 30A to take Junction Road over the Schoharie Creek. There's a field there and a turtle looking to cross the road. This past week, a mile from this spot was sadly a turtle dead on the side of the road.

I find the turtle fascinating, with its hard shell of protection and the ability to draw inside the shell to protect itself from harm. Unfortunately, with our man-made machines, the speed with which we travel, and our lack of attention, a turtle's hard shell is no match. The shell won't protect the turtle from humanity, only animal predators.

We humans are much like the turtle. When we sense danger, we retreat into our own hard shell rather than allow people to care for us. We are vulnerable. We, too, take risks to cross to the other side, to get to where God needs us to be. We also retreat to our place of safety when we sense danger, betrayal, or

brokenness. What is your safe haven? Do you rest in the love and protection of God? Do you rest in the care of your brothers and sisters in Christ? Psalm 61:1-5 assures us of the protection that God offers: strong tower, refuge, tent, shelter, and wings. These are the words the Psalmist uses when we need protection, not a hard shell like the turtle or our human walls of defense.

As we move through our summer months and have opportunities to spend time with one another and with those we don't know very well, may we get out of our hard shell of protection; take a risk and connect with other people, knowing that God is our tent and shelter, a wing for us to take refuge under. When we need to retreat, may it be into the soft wings of God who loves us and cares for us, not our hard shell of defense. Let's shed some shells this summer for soft wings!
