### Stained-Glass Article

#### Research on Stained Glass Windows – Schoharie Reformed Church

We are undertaking the refurbishment of our stained-glass windows in the Schoharie Reformed Church. Why? Because they are currently 128 years old and show the wear and tear that occurs over time. Over the past several years, I have been researching the families that donated these windows and thought that you might enjoy reading about them.

In the "History of the Schoharie Reformed Church 1721-1996", under the section entitled "Celebrating the 50th Anniversary of the New Church Building – 1894", it states: "Nowhere in the records is any significant mention of the beautiful windows, but, based on the fact that one of them bears the date of 1894, it is a good bet that they were placed in the church during this time." Under the section entitled "Let There Be Light – The Church Windows" it states: "The church is graced by seven wonderful leaded glass windows. Each window has an inscription that dedicates it."

The dedication that I will share in this article is to Caroline Von Linden. It states:
In Memory of Caroline Von Linden
March 28<sup>th</sup>, 1836 – Apr 24<sup>th</sup>, 1894
By her Husband and Children

#### Stained-Glass Window – Caroline Von Linden

Caroline was born Caroline von Normann-Ehrenfels on March 28, 1836, in Wurtemburg, Germany. It is not clear when she came to America or when she married her husband, Charles (Carl) Von Linden, but by 1875 she is living in Schoharie with her husband, Charles (aka Carl) and their 8 children: Caroline (15), Charles (14), Mary (12), Pauleen (10), Emma (8), Albert (5), Charlotte (3), and Matilda (1) were living with them. Her husband, Charles, was a farmer.

All the children were still living at home in 1892 with Caroline and Charles. Caroline died in 1894 (the same year the stained-glass windows were dedicated) and was buried at the Old Stone Fort Cemetery.

The oldest daughter, Caroline, was living with her younger brother, Albert, and his family in 1900. On September 10, 1913, at age 52, Caroline married Cyrus Saddlemire in Columbia, NY. This was her first marriage but his third marriage. Caroline was living in Hudson, NY when they filed for their marriage license. Caroline died in 1918 or 1919 and was buried at the Old Stone Fort Cemetery in Schoharie. Her name is on the gravestone with her husband, Cyrus Saddlemire, and his two other wives. It does not appear that Caroline had any children of her own.

Their second child, Charles Von Linden, married Imogene B. Filkins in 1896 and they had 3 children: Mary G., Eberhardt Carl, and Harold George. Charles died in 1951.

Their third child, Mary Von Linden, never married and died on February 11<sup>th</sup>, 1940. After her mother, Caroline's, death in 1894, Mary continued to live with her father on Grand Street in Schoharie until he passed away in 1916. After that, Mary and 2 of her younger sisters, Emma and Matilda, continued to live together in the family home with a nephew, Albert Hugo Von Linden.

Their fourth child, Pauleen Von Linden, married a butcher, Nicholas Rickard, on March 24, 1909. They were both 40 years old. They lived at 109 Grand St. near Pauleen's father, 3 sisters, and nephew.

### Stained Glass Article Cont...

Pauleen died on December 28<sup>th</sup>, 1940 – the same year as her older sister, Mary. Pauleen did not have any children.

Their fifth child, Emma Von Linden, never married and lived in the family home on Grand St. until at least 1940. She passed away in 1948. Emma never had any children.

Their sixth child, Albert Von Linden, married Edna C. Rickard on June 5<sup>th</sup>, 1895, in Wright. They had at least 7 children.

Their seventh child, Charlotte (Lillie) Von Linden, never married. She died on March 2, 1941, in Schoharie.

Interesting Note – On Sunday, December 6, 1970, Mrs. Donna Morey was ordained and installed as a deacon in the Schoharie Reformed Church. Donna was the great-granddaughter of Caroline Von Linden. Donna Morey and Mrs. Frances Tripp were the first two women in our congregation to become deacons. According to the "History of the Schoharie Reformed Church

1721-1996", the "installation of women to the Consistory caused quite a stir at the next quarterly meeting of the Classis, held on January 26, 1971. The Schoharie Reformed Church submitted an Overture to the Classis, giving reasons for the ordination of two women, and asking that the Classis approve. In turn, the church was severely reprimanded for ignoring the Book of Church Order, which

stated that only men could serve on Consistory.... Finally, the General Synod agreed to the ordination of women on Consistory, and the Classis of Schoharie followed suit. Thus, the preceding ordinations of women in the Schoharie Reformed Church became legal, and now it is quite normal for women to serve on the Consistory, both as Deacons and Elders."

<u>Interesting Note #2</u> – One headstone in the Old Stone Fort Cemetery has the names of 4 of Caroline's unmarried daughters (Marie, Emma, Charlotte, and Mathilde) who all died in the 1940s. Also on the headstone is the name of the nephew, Hugo, who lived with the sisters for many years off and on from the time he was just an infant. Grace was Hugo's wife.

<u>Interesting Note #3</u> – Caroline Von Linden had a last will and testament that was signed by Ralph Brewster. Ralph's family donated another of the stained -glass windows in the church. Ralph Brewster was a lawyer in Schoharie and

the great-grandfather of Samuel Scranton. The July newsletter will have an article about the Brewster

family for your reading pleasure.
