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"In Step with The Spirit"

*"If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit."-*Galatians 5:25

Have you ever bought a piece of fruit in the store that you were really excited about? You bought it because it just looked so delicious, it was bright and shiny, full of life and color, and smelled really good! Then you got it home, placed it on the counter assuring yourself that you would enjoy it soon.

But then...

Life got busy and it seemed like every time you looked at that piece of fruit on the counter it just wasn't the right time to sit down and enjoy it. "Later." You told yourself. "I will enjoy it much more later." But then when later came you felt more like ice cream, or popcorn, and not fruit. Then after a while in all the distractions and the busyness of life you forgot about it. Until...

You notice fruit flies fluttering about your counter. You swat them away and look for the source, and there it is on your counter. What was once bright and beautiful and smelled so delicious is now brown, wrinkled, molded, and rotting. The piece of fruit that you looked forward to enjoying in your stomach is now only good to be fed to the compost bin or the trash can.

Maybe this has never happened to you with edible fruit, but this illustration is meant to help us (pun intended) plant the seeds to remind us it can happen with the fruit of the Spirit if we don't attend to them or to our relationship with the Holy Spirit in our lives. I (Pastor Mike) have greatly enjoyed our journey through the fruit of the Spirit over these past several weeks. We have learned about what each one means, why they are important, and we have wrestled with some challenging questions about what it means for us to grow and to live by these fruits in our lives. Growing the fruits of the Spirit in our lives is something that is our responsibility to take on as beloved children of God and as faithful followers of Jesus. While it is the fruit "of" the Spirit, it is not something we simply sit back and receive from God and are then set for life. Growing and nurturing these fruits and our relationship with the Spirit is our work to do. It is our work to decide how we will live by these fruits in our lives. It is our work to open ourselves to the work of the Spirit in us. It is our work to confront the voices of shame telling us "You're not enough" and the voices of pride telling us "You don't need this." It is our work to admit with honesty, courage, and compassion when we have not lived by these fruits in ways we desired and have made messes because of it. It is our work to ask for the help when we need it, and it is our work to encourage one another as we live and work together in Christ's shared mission of bringing wholeness to the world.

Leaving the Fruit of the Spirit on the counter of our lives will rob us of the joy of living "in step with the Spirit" as Paul writes in Galatians. It will also leave us hungering for the fuller life God desires to give us. Let us seek not just to learn about the Fruit of the Spirit (as good as that is), but also seek to make our relationship with the Spirit, and the fruits that grow from it a part of our everyday lives. It will take some patience (just like the fruit) because change isn't easy and doesn't come right away, and we will never do it perfectly. It will take hard work, courage, and compassion along the way. But the more we can engage in living in the Spirit, the more this fruit will become a part of our lives as a blessing to us and to the world around us. To me (last pun I promise) that sounds very "appealing"!

The Food Pantry strives hard to serve the many families in our community. Items of great need are cleaning supplies, paper products-paper towels/toilet paper.
