#### **Living Resurrection!**



"Then the angel spoke to the women. "Don't be frightened!" he said. "I know you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified, but he isn't here! For he has come back to life again, just as he said he would. Come in and see where his body was lying... And now, go quickly and tell his disciples that he has risen from the dead, and that he is going to Galilee to meet them there. That is my message to them."

- Matthew 28:5-7NLT

In each Gospel account there are things that are unique to that storyteller's perspective of the events that occurred on that first Easter morning at the tomb. One of the things I (Pastor Mike) find interesting about Matthew's account is the invitation of the angel to the women to come and take a look inside the tomb

(because the word of a divinely illuminated cosmic being wouldn't be enough to convince them!). But it makes sense when you think about the fact that what happened through Jesus' death and resurrection completely rewrites our entire understanding of reality as it relates to death and life. None of them had any concept of this even being a possibility, which is why they could not understand his words to them about this while he was alive. Nothing like it had happened before or would ever happen again. Then the women are sent on ahead to tell the rest of the disciples that Jesus has risen from the dead and that he is going to Galilee to meet them there. Imagine receiving that news! Not only is Jesus alive, but he is coming to see you!

For most of as Christians, Easter is a glorious day of celebration where we sing the great uplifting hymns of our tradition and hear the familiar story, and then later we may hunt for eggs and stuff ourselves on good food. All of this is truly a wonderful time of celebration. But in the life of the church, Easter is not just a day – it is a whole season. In fact, the season of Easter lasts all the way up until Pentecost – 50 days! During those fifty days we often reflect on the stories of Jesus' appearances following his resurrection.

Why do we need a whole season of Easter? It is for more than just finishing off the leftovers! I am continually learning resurrection as a new reality. It isn't something we are meant to just believe. It is more than a "knowledge" we claim for our lives. It is a new reality we are called to intentionally live into as a way of being!

Often during times of failure or struggle I (Pastor Mike) all too easily return to old stories of shame, deficiency, and powerlessness, where my reality gets distorted through lenses of blame and shame. For me it is not enough just to "tell a new story" because the old stories have too much history, power, and sway over my being. So, what do I do? I am finding that I am in need of not only trying to convince myself of a new story – but I am in need of the daily practice of living into a new story. As Richard Rohr says, "We don't think ourselves into new ways of living. We live ourselves into new ways of thinking." On Easter Sunday, Pastor Sherri's sermon also included a video clip from Richard Rohr who spoke about the reality that we as human beings are more naturally inclined towards the telling disempowering stories and running away from resurrection (the two heavenly beings at the tomb in Luke's Gospel ask – "Why do you look for the living among the dead?" Luke 24:5). Instead, Rohr goes on to state, we as people need to continually and intentionally turn our lives towards the hope of resurrection.

That is why the angel doesn't just say, "Jesus is Risen!" And then leave them with that bit of good news — as glorious as it is! They are to go and tell the story and to prepared to meet Jesus because Resurrection is not only the good news we celebrate, it is the good life we are invited into through lives lived out in love, forgiveness, generosity, service, and justice with God and others.

Friends, during this Easter Season, may we come to know more deeply this reality of resurrection that has rewritten our reality. May we know it not just in our heads, or in our hearts, but through our lives that we may grow into being resurrection people who live a new story of life from death. This is the hope that is given to each of us through the power of Christ's resurrection. It is not just a new life after this one, it is a real and practical hope that is meant to give power to our lives here and now as we live our lives!

This has been such a strange season of life for me these last two and half years as I've struggled with my body, including having 4 surgeries. Thank you for all of your prayers, cards, emails, text messages, phone calls, and all of the ways you have been caring for me. Some of you have been honest enough to share that your concern for me has meant you have "not wanted to bother you." Please know that meaningful work and relating with others has been a part of what keeps me going! I will continue to discern what I am able and unable to do, given my physical condition, which we are praying will continue to improve. Please give me that opportunity! You are good medicine! It is not possible for you to "bother me!" I want to hear what is happening with you, and your life as we all continue to "Live in Love and Grow in God" together.
