A Fruitful Life That's APPEALING:

"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Against such things there is no law. Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the sinful nature with its passions and desires. Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, provoking and envying each other." - Galatians 5:22-26 NIV

What makes a fruit tree produce good fruit? A little while after we moved into our house on Fair Street many years ago, we had a small clump of pine trees removed from our back yard. The plan was to replace them with some fruit trees. We decided to plant two Asian Pear trees and two cherry trees. I learned that you can't only have one fruit tree to produce fruit but you need at least two in order for them to crosspollinate. Over the past several years since then, we have been blessed many times over with good crops of pears, but our cherry trees, despite the fact that they continue to grow have never produced any fruit.

What helps make a fruit tree to bear fruit? We can probably all name the obvious list of answers such as, water, sunlight, good soil, pruning, protection from pests and diseases, and time. Most of us already know these things. We know you can't put a fruit tree in a dark closet and expect it to grow fruit. You can't put a tree in cement and expect it to grow fruit, and you can't feed a fruit tree cans of diet soda and expect it to grow fruit, and you can't place a fruit tree in isolation and expect it to grow fruit.

The lessons of growing a fruit tree are also really important for us to plant into our own hearts and lives. It is surprising to me how often I (Pastor Mike) can miss these truths when it comes to living by the Fruits of the Spirit that come to us through the Holy Spirit. Sometimes I act as though the fruits of the Spirit, *love*, *joy*, *peace*, *patience*, *kindness*, *goodness*, *faithfulness*, *gentleness*, *and self-control*, are things I am to produce through my own energy and efforts. While it is true that we are all participants in growing and developing these fruits within ourselves, it is important to remember that they are and always will be the fruits "of" the Spirit and not fruits "like" the Spirit. God has a wonderful heavenly habit of doing everything through the relationship with God's creation! Like a fruit tree that needs water, soil, and sun, we need our relationship with God to grow and produce this fruit in us. It is out of the tending to our relationship with God through the Holy Spirit that these fruits take root and have life in us.

Franciscan Priest, Spiritual Director, and author Richard Rohr writes,

The goal of the spiritual life is to allow the Spirit of Christ to influence all our activity, prayer as well as service. Our role in this process is to provide conditions in our lives to enable us to live in tune with [Christ's] Spirit. Our effort is not a self-conscious striving to fill ourselves with the important Christian virtues; it is more getting out of the way and allowing [Christ's] Spirit to transform all our activities. Christ will do the rest. His Spirit has joined ours and will never abandon us.

As we explore the fruits of the Spirit during this Season of Easter and on into Pentecost let us find ourselves drawing closer to God through the Holy Spirit that we may continue to see these fruits growing in us and giving us life to share with the world! Let us plant ourselves more deeply in our relationships with God and tune our lives to the presence and the work of the Holy Spirit in us, and beyond us! Let us seek the light of God's wisdom in times of reflection, and in worship together. Let us be fed by the water of God's goodness and grace by giving thanks, and practicing forgiveness. Finally, let us also remember, like the fruit tree, that our relationship with God cannot grow in isolation, but instead we need the community of each other as followers of Jesus to help us grow into the people God created us to be! So let us deepen our relationships through practicing deep listening and working to share more authentically with one another.

We have been blessed by a Holy Spirit that has come to nurture our lives in relationship with God, and through our relationships with each other, to grow good fruit in us, and invites us to join with that same Spirit in sharing that fruit with the world! Let us tend to the orchard of our hearts and lives that God's Spirit may grow us into a truly fruitful people! Amen.
