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Are you plugged in?

"So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness."

-Colossians 2:6-7

"It doesn't work!" He declared to me most assuredly. "Watch." He turned the knob on the lamp back and forth several times but no light came on. My first response was to ask, "Did you check the bulb?" So, he removed the bulb from the lamp and went and found a new one. He screwed in the new bulb and turned the knob again several times but still no light came on. "I think we should just throw it away." He said frustrated. "Stupid piece of junk! All I wanted to do was move it from one corner of my bedroom to the other and now it doesn't work!" "Maybe the knob is broken?" I wondered. I examined the knob but sure enough it clicked on and off appropriately, but still there was no light. "Just forget it," he said, giving up on any hope of getting it to work. "Could there be a short in the cord?" I followed the cord from the base of the lamp back to... and there it was, the reason why the lamp wasn't working. I laughed when I saw the plug lying lifeless

on the floor, disconnected from the outlet, the power source. It wasn't plugged in! All of that time, all of that frustration, all to discover it wasn't plugged in. The lamp had gotten moved across the room but then distractions happened and it never got plugged in!

Perhaps you can relate somewhat to this situation in your own life. Have you ever wondered why some electrical appliance wasn't working, only to discover that it wasn't plugged in? It probably happens more than we'd like to admit. What about when it comes to being "plugged in" with regards to our best lives, and especially to the living out of our faith? Our faith connects us to our greatest source of power, the center of our hope, confidence, peace, joy, gratefulness, and balance for our lives found in God. But only if it remains plugged in! Have you ever declared that something in your life wasn't working, tried to change some things around but to no avail, put yourself down, and then said, "forget it" and given up? I wonder…were you "plugged in"?

When it comes to being our best selves, living fully alive, and becoming the people God created us to be, we need to be plugged in. We need to be plugged in to the voice that reminds us we are beloved children of God. We need to be plugged in to the God who has power to change and transform our lives. We need to be plugged in to the hope and grace that can lift us out of our struggle and despairs. This is not easy, or simple, it requires hard work to change from who we learned to be in order to protect ourselves from harm in the world, to who we have been created to be in Christ, but it can only happen when we are plugged in!

The Apostle Paul writes his letter to the church in Colossae to remind them to remain "plugged in" to the source of their truest and best life, which is Jesus Christ. As a young church of Gentile (non-Jewish) believers, the Colossians are experiencing all kinds of pressure to adhere to other additional practices, rituals, and beliefs beyond their faith in Jesus Christ and the Gospel they have been taught in order to truly be considered among the people of God. Paul's letter is meant to remind them that they already have been given all that they need for living their best life of faith and he wants to encourage them to remain "plugged in" to Christ!

What are the ways you are currently plugging in to Christ to discover your best life and the life of your faith? Perhaps it is through your devotional life, time in prayer, books you are reading, meditation or another spiritual discipline. Or maybe it is through Bible Study, or acts of service you are involved in, or conversations with others, or spiritual direction, or even coaching. If nothing comes to mind, then what is getting in the way? We want to encourage you to wonder and to make an intentional plan about how you are going to live plugged in so that, as Paul writes to the Colossians, you too may, *continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness.* " This is NOT the religious life, or even the morally good life. Paul is in fact speaking against the moralistic and religious life that focuses solely on the "do's and don'ts." His desire for the Colossians and for us is to connect to the fullness of "real life" found in relational connectivity to God in Christ, where we take on intentional practices and ways of being that help keep us plugged in to God! Because being plugged in is the real life you were created to live as your best self, fully alive in Christ to whom and through whom we all belong.

Stained Glass Window Fundraising Update

Recall that we are raising funds to rebuild our 125 year old stained glass windows that are slowly sagging, cracking, and breaking due to age, gravity, and heat. Two contractors respectively proposed \$125,000 and \$207,000 to rebuild them.





September was a very good month. First, \$1,300 was cleared at the Village Wide Garage Sale September 7. Many people worked Friday night sorting and setting up, then ran the sale on Saturday. It was a great time of fellowship not just among our church family but also with the community.

"Good" stuff donated by congregation members, great weather, and a good turn-out of visitors added up to a very successful fun day. In a profitable sideline, Luke Jacobs grilled and sold breakfast sandwiches out by the sidewalk. Many thanks for the canopies that were loaned.



The big news is that the A. Lindsey & Olive B. O'Connor Foundation of Hobart awarded the Church a \$50,000 grant toward the windows. This is a large chunk of our need; and will help build momentum and confidence as the Fundraising/Fellowship Committee develops additional events and programs as well as pursuing other grant opportunities.

The next fundraiser the Committee is looking at will be a Christmas event tied into the Village holiday celebration and tree lighting. Watch for details to be announced.
